## WRA GENERAL RULES

- 1. All cars and drivers must pass an annual safety inspection before being allowed on any track at a WRA sanctioned event. Specific Rules are covered in the Safety Inspection Form as posted on the WRA Website, and available from any Board Member.
- 2. All cars must have a fire extinguisher in plain sight and readily available in their pit. A 5 gallon bucket of water is highly recommended best way to douse a methanol fire.
- 3. Children under 12 years of age, when in the pit area, must be under the control and supervision of an adult at all times.
- 4. Drivers and Car Owners must attend all meetings called at the event by the Race Director. Failure to attend will result in withdrawal of participation privileges.
- 5. WRA events are exhibitions, not races. Should a driver exhibit excessive speed or dangerous driving, at the discretion of WRA Officials, both he and the car will not only be done for that event but also subject to suspension/expulsion provisions covered in the WRA By-Laws.
- 6. Drivers new to the WRA will be required to start at the back of the field in heat or feature events, or during warm-ups to stay low on the track and pass only cars being started until they have demonstrated their ability to drive in a safe manner and to adhere to the rules and format as established by WRA Officials. WRA car owners who want to allow nonmembers to drive their cars at a WRA sanctioned event will be allowed to do so under these conditions:
  - (a) The driver must sign a membership application and initial the portion of the Safety Inspection Form from the beginning to the end of the Driver section, having read the rules included, said reading to be performed under supervision of a disinterested WRA Board Member who will countersign. This is to insure that

the driver has actually read and understands them. The form will be marked "One Time Gratis Test Drive"

- (b) There will be no fee for this one time test drive.
- (c) Any time a car is driven by ANYONE who is not the regular driver, the car must display a yellow ribbon attached to the roll bar so other drivers and Officials will know that the car does not have its regular driver at the wheel. It is the Car owner's responsibility to furnish and attach the ribbon.
- (d) Any provisional driver must attend the Driver's meeting as well as consult with the Race Director. Remember, participation with WRA is a privilege, not a right.
- 7. No alcoholic beverages are to be consumed at any time before, during or after an event. It does not matter what other participants are doing.
- 8. We are exhibiting in the spirit of good fellowship and the desire to share our enthusiasm for vintage open wheel race cars. The event is not the place to air complaints about club policies, by-laws, rules etc.

Our goal is to aid the promoter in putting on a good and delay-free show, not bend up equipment and especially not to injure anyone. Failure to adhere to the spirit of these rules will result in disciplinary actions as covered in our By-Laws.
